

Risuona nelle parole di Giovanni l'annunzio del tempo nuovo, il tempo in cui tutti sono chiamati alla salvezza.

L'immagine di Gesù, Agnello e Servo, ci richiama allo stile di vita di sacrificio per amore; un offerta generosa della nostra vita che ci immerge nella vita stessa di Dio. Ancora l'immagine di Gesu' come agnello ci invita a dare la nostra vita per Dio e per il bene e salvezza degli altri ovunque ci troviamo.

Today, we begin the ordinary time of the liturgical year and the readings tell us about the identity of Jesus and what his mission is. He is the Lamb of God: "Behold! The Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world". The word Lamb in the Jewish religious life has deep meaning. It is a symbol of purity and of innocence; it is also a sign of sacrifice for salvation.

Jesus is the Lamb of God, who died for our sins as the 1st reading says: ".... Like a lamb, led to the slaughter... He was wounded for our sins, bruised for our iniquities. He has taken upon himself the chastisement that makes us whole".

John recognizes that Jesus is not only who takes away the sins of the Jews and Christians but also all the sins of the world. The message is plain: If Jesus takes away the sins of the world, then, of course, he takes away our sin, whatever our sin might be, how deep the hole we have dug, wherever we find ourselves. He is our merciful Savior and we need to trust in his mercy and love.

PILGRIMAGE TO HOLY LAND

Under the spiritual leadership of Fr. Paolas Beraki Pastor, St. Wilfrid Church in Toronto

October 22 - 31, 2023 - 10 days - \$3,899.00 (Toronto Dep. incl. all taxes and tipe

Oct.22 Afternoon departure from Toronto to Tel Aviv.

Oct.23 Morning arrival in Tel Aviv. Upon meeting our guide we are transferred to our hotel in Galilee. Time for rest, dinner and overnight.

Oct.24 After breakfast we depart for Tiberias. We travel by boat on the Sea of Galilee, visit Capemaum, home of St. Peter and the site of Jesus' preaching, on to Tabgha to see the Church of the Multiplication with its beautiful 5th century fish mosaic. Visit Magdala, home town of Mary Magdalene. We also visit the Church of the Primacy and celebrate Mass on the Mount of the Beatitudes. Return to our hotel for dinner and overnight.

Oct.25

Oct.25 This morning we start our tour in Cana – the site of Jesus' first miracle. Here we celebrate a marriage renewal ceremony. We move on to Nazareth where we celebrate Mass at the Basilica of the Annunciation and we visit Mary's Well and St. Joseph's Carpentry Shop. In the afternoon we ascend Mount Tabor – the Mount of the Transfiguration. Return to our hotel for dinner and overnight.

ct.26 Today we depart Galilee for Judea and the area of Jerusalem. En route we visit Haifa and Mt. Carmel (Muhraqa), the "burning place" where Elijah called fire down to confound the prophets of Baal. Here we celebrate Mass. We continue via Cesarea by the Sea to Judea for our dinner and overnight.

Oct.27 After breakfast we tour Mt. of Olives. We visit the church of Pater Noster, Garden of Gethsemane and continue to Bethlehem where Jesus was born. We visit the Manger, the Crusaders' Cloister and the Grotto of St. Jerome – Shepherd's field. Return to our hotel for dinner and overnight.

28 Today's journey takes us to the ancient city of Jerusalem: St. Ann's Church, Pool of Bethesda, Pilate's Judgment Hall, the Chapel of the Flagellation and the Arch of Ecce Homo, the convent of the sisters of Zion. We continue with the Stations of the Cross – Via Dolorosa to the Holy Sepulchre. Mass will be celebrated in one of the many churches of Jerusalem. In the afternoon we visit the Western Wall, also called the "Walling Wall". Return to our hotel for dinner.

Oct.29 Mount Zion with the Upper Room (Room of the Last Supper) and the Church of St. Peter's in Gallicantu. Continue to visit Ein Karem, St. John's town and then tothe village of Bethary with the tomb of Lazarus. Our next stop is Jericho, the oldest inhabited city in the world. We view Mt. Temptation and transfer to our hotel in Jericho for dinner and overnight.

Dct.30 Today we visit Qasr El Yahud, the place where Jesus was baptized. Continue to Masada, the famous Jewish fortress, the Dead Sea and Qumran, where the Dead Sea Scrolls were discovered in 1947. Time for floating in the Dead Sea before returning to our hotel for dinner and overnight.

Oct.31 After breakfast we are transferred to the airport in Tel Aviv for a flight to Toronto. TEL: 877-999-8868
