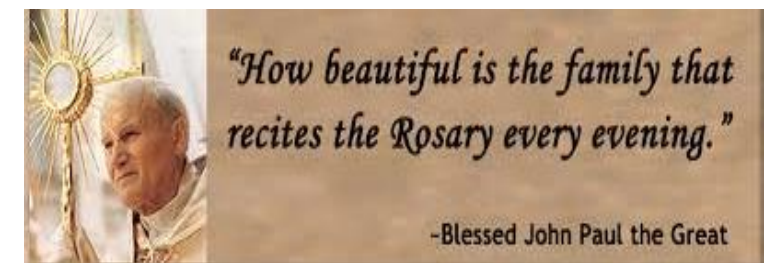

C'è sempre un delicato rapporto fra l'intenzione e l'azione. Tutti siamo coscienti che spesso facciamo tanti "propositi belli", ma "poco di più"; oppure che le nostre azioni e le nostre parole non sono frutto di retta intenzione del cuore, ma, pur nella loro giustizia e verità esterna, sono dettate da orgoglio e desiderio di affermazione personale. La Parola che la liturgia odierna ci propone aiuta tutti noi a riflettere su questo intricato, ma ineludibile rapporto, fra intenzione e azione appunto. I due figli, a cui il padre chiede di andare a lavorare nella vigna (Vangelo), si pongono come esempio di due modalità differenti di reazione di fronte a uno stimolo. Il primo manifesta immediatamente ciò che ha nel cuore: dice di non averne voglia; il secondo, invece, manifesta l'impulsività delle nostre reazioni: dice prontamente che darà seguito all'invito del padre, ma poi la sua azione è del tutto contraria. Il primo compie la volontà del padre non tanto perché poi va nella vigna, ma perché si pente: il pentimento è anzitutto quel dono del discernimento del cuore che permette di compiere la cosa giusta ed è il dono che vogliamo chiedere alla grazia di Dio.

The parable today, teaches us that promises can never take the place of performance, and fine words are never a substitute for fine deeds. In other words, the parable clearly teaches that the Christian Way is followed in performance, not in promise alone, and that the mark of a Christian is obedience, graciously and courteously given. We are not supposed to say "yes" to God on Sundays and "no" to God on weekdays. God doesn't want polite but hypocritical words, for that isn't obedience at all. "Merciful and quick to forgive," God tolerates willful, even blasphemous disobedience, provided repentance follows. Repentance is first and foremost that gift of discernment of the heart that allows us to do the right thing and it is the gift that we want to ask for from the grace of God. God remains faithful, always ready to receive repentant sinners. He never abandons us even when we abandon Him.

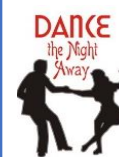

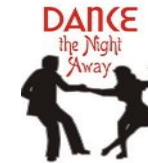

St. Wilfrid (c. 633 – c. 709) was an English bishop and saint. Born a Northumbrian noble, he entered religious life as a teenager and studied at Lindisfarne, at Canterbury, in Gaul, and at Rome; Born in Northumberland in 634,

St. Wilfrid was an outstanding personage of his day, extremely capable and possessed of unbounded courage, remaining firm in his convictions despite running afoul of civil and ecclesiastical authorities. He helped bring the discipline of the English Church into line with that of Rome. He was also a dedicated pastor and a zealous and skilled missionary.

Memorial



This Memorial (originally 'Our Lady of Victories') commemorates the battle of Lepanto (7 October 1571), when the Christian fleet defeated the Turks. The victory was attributed by Pope St Pius V to the recitation of the Holy Rosary. This great Marian prayer is sometimes traced back to St Dominic de Guzman and his confrères, preaching against the Albigensian heresy in the 13th century, although it seems more likely to have its familiar form in the 15th century.
